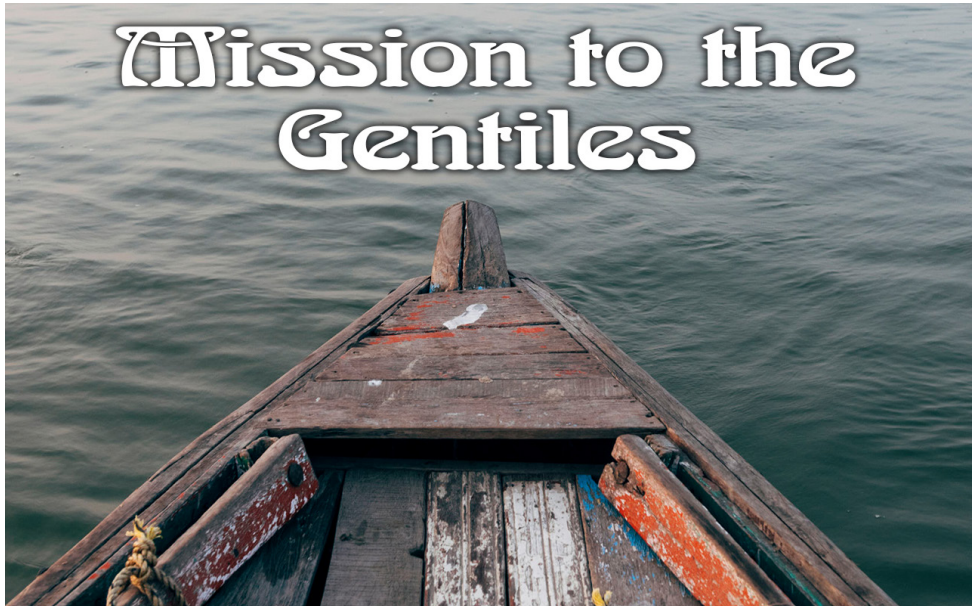


Ferryhill Parish Church
